Carbon Monoxide: The 'Silent Killer'

As winter nears, we will be spending more time indoors using our heaters and fuel burning appliances, which increases our risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Carbon monoxide is a colourless, odourless gas that if inhaled in unsafe amounts can be fatal. Fortunately, carbon monoxide poisoning is preventable, if you keep these tips in mind:

- Have your heating system, hot water heater, and fuel-burning appliances inspected annually.
- Turn on your exhaust fan or open a window anytime you use your stove.
- During and after storms inspect your gas dryer, stove, furnace, or fireplace to ensure the vents are not blocked.
- If you have a wood-burning fireplace or stove, ensure the flue is clean and working properly. Keep the flue open so gases escape until all embers are completely out.
- Never idle your car in an enclosed garage.



- Do not use a kerosene heater, gas barbecue, or generator inside your house.
- Have at least one carbon monoxide detector on every floor and near sleeping areas and ensure it's certified by national safety standards.
- Replace your device before the expiry date or for batteryoperated devices, change the batteries every 6 months. If you have a plug-in alarm, ensure it has a back-up battery.

If your carbon monoxide alarm goes off, escape your house to fresh air immediately and call 9-1-1.
