Streamlining Your Garden Work

One option is a **drip irrigation system**, which releases the right amount of water directly into the soil where needed. A slow drip of water is released through tubing with emitters connected to a water source, such as a water storage tub.

Wicking systems are another option for containers that draw water up from a built-in reservoir at the bottom of a container.

For a simple DIY option, you can use an **upturned plastic bottle** placed near the roots of a plant. Make small holes in the cap with a nail and hammer for the slow release of water and cut off the bottom of the bottle so you can refill it. You can also buy **discreet or decorative watering spikes** you can place in containers that work the same way as an upturned bottle.

Having an automated watering system can offer **peace of mind when you are away**, while also saving you time so you can enjoy your plants without having to spend as much time maintaining them.
